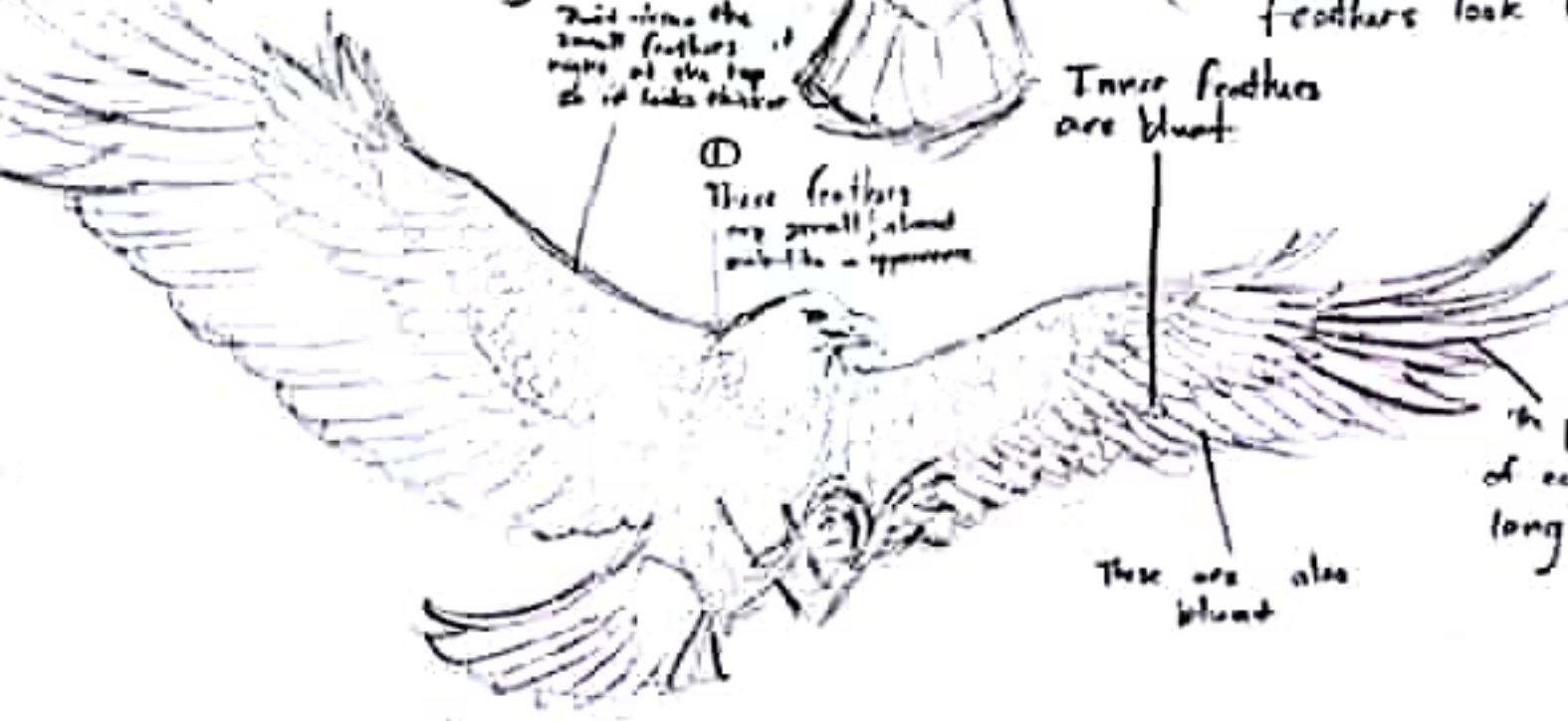
This is how I've split up the wing sections

These feathers are blunt

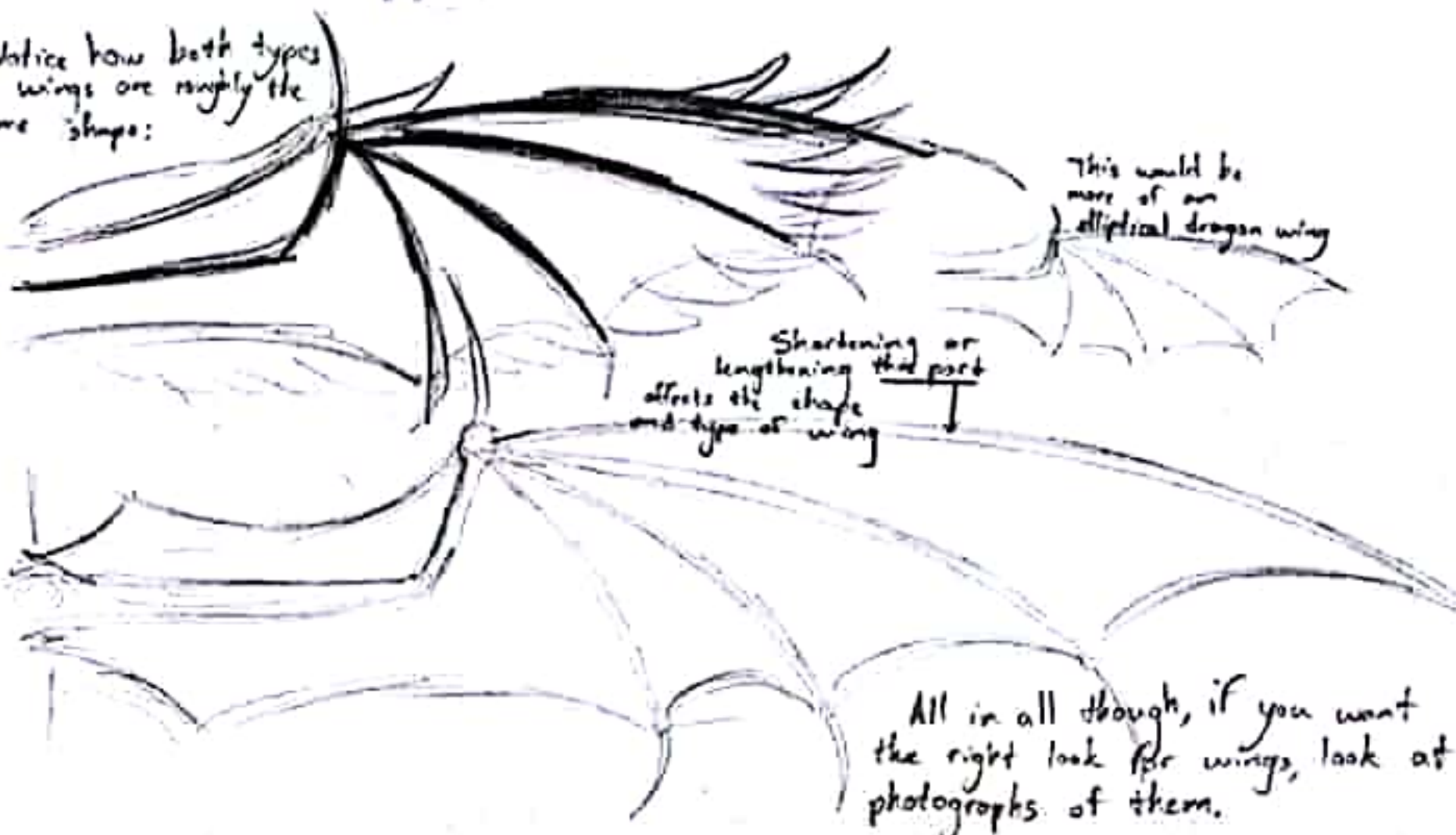
① These feathers are small, almost oval-like in appearance



The primary feathers of eagles are massive, long.

These are also blunt

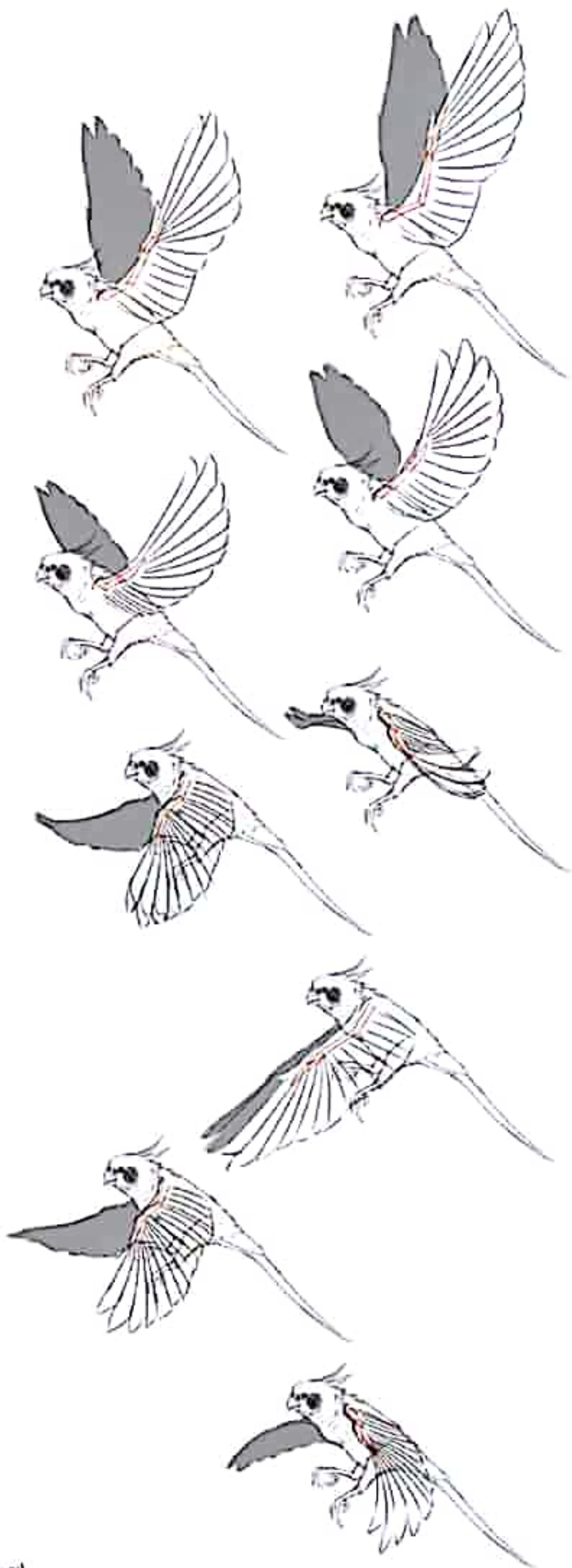
Notice how both types of wings are roughly the same shape:



This would be more of an elliptical dragon wing

Shortening or lengthening that part affects the shape and type of wing

All in all though, if you want the right look for wings, look at photographs of them.

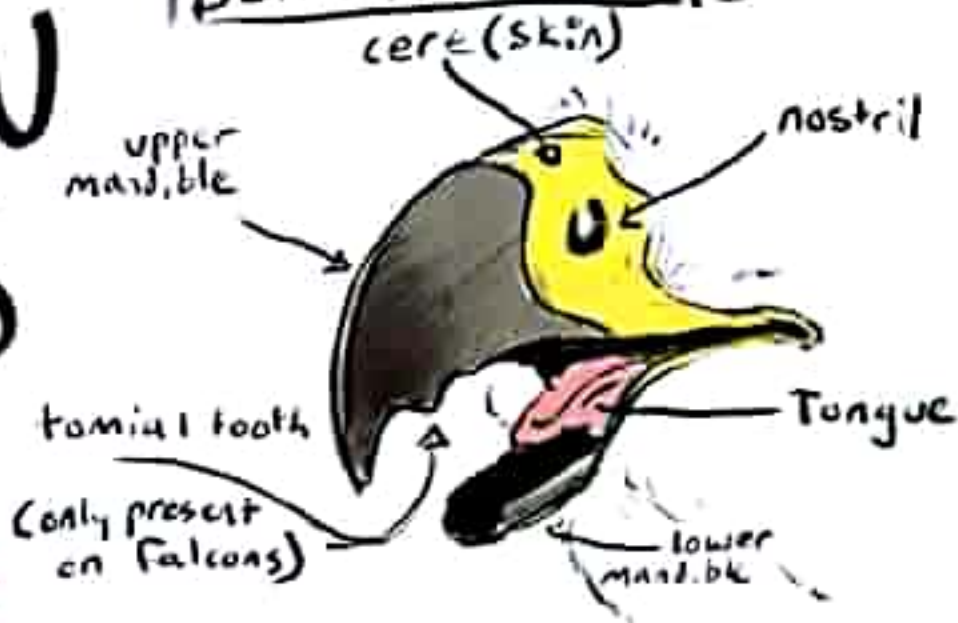

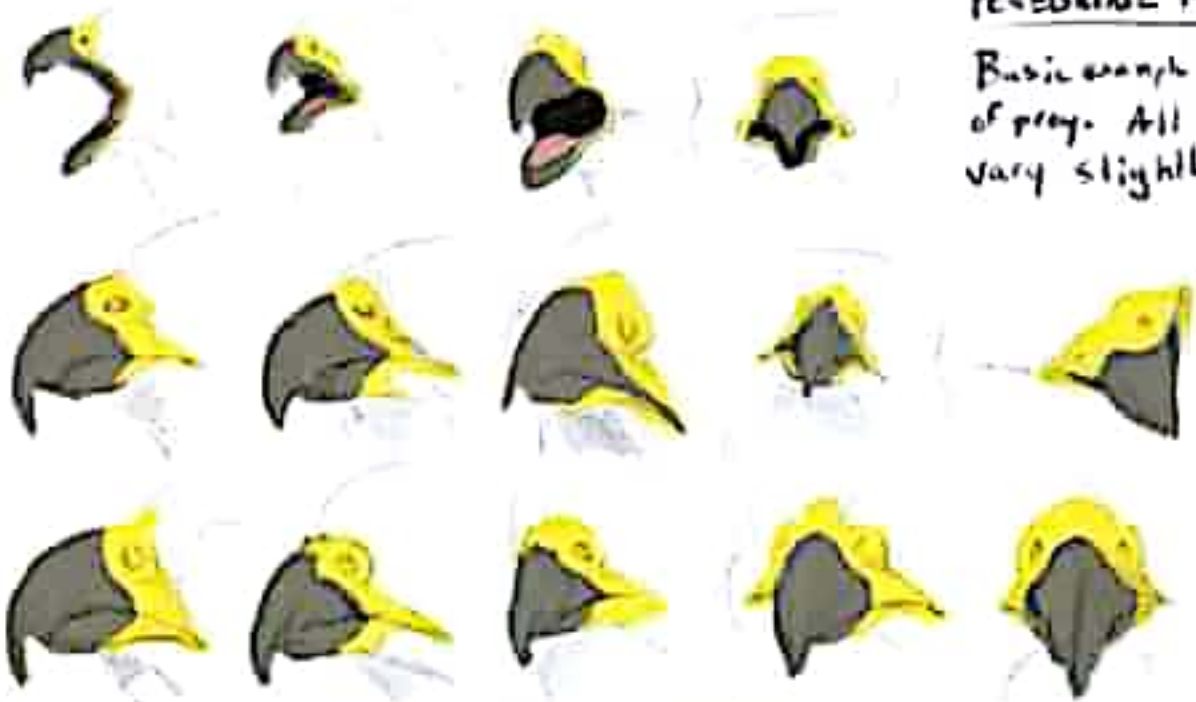

PEREGRINE FALCON BEAKS

Basic example of a smaller bird of prey. All types of birds vary slightly, so keep that in mind.



Expressions can be forced by manipulating the "lips" of the beak along with the eyes & body language - just like any other animal



1 DRAW A CIRCLE WITH A LINE HALFWAY THROUGH

2 BLOCK OUT THE BEAK SHAPE

3 ADD FINER DETAILS LIKE SENS, NOSTRIL, TOOTH

4 ATTACH TO BIRD FACE
